Workplace violence is the number one cause of death or injury on the job for women, and the second or third leading cause of death or injury for men, depending upon the source of your statistics. According to an OSHA report, one in seven victims of workplace murder was killed by a fellow employee or a personal associate. The potentially violent worker has been profiled as a person with a history of violence toward women, children, or animals. Statistically, violence-prone employees are more likely to be male and over the age of 34. The worker may link his self-esteem to his job.
